Whereas his most excellent and reuerend
council and privie councell by matter of publique rati-
on of grete conuentement especially consideringe that by re-
gionall licencess of the late tyme mani evill and
detested persons haue bene incouenient to print and
sell hereticall, schismatycall blasphemous, seditious &
treasonable booke, pamphlets and payers and still
doe continuallly shew their unlawfull and exorbitant
practise to the high dishonour of almighty God, incan-
danging the peare of these Realme, and raising
a sedition to his most excellent Maistrie, and his
government for rettention whereof divers meaneys han-
ne advised them by redusing and limiting the number of
printing presse, and by ordering and setting the said
clerke or Master of printing by clerk of Parliament in man-
er hysmyn after is expressed. The Kinges most excellent
Maistrie by and with the consent and advise of the
lords spirituall and temporall and Commons in this
present Parlyament assyndis both therfore ordaine
and enacte clerk bothe it ordyned and enacted by the
cluthorite aforesaid that no person, or persons
whatsoever shall perfune to print or cause to bee
printed either within this Realme of England, or any
other his Majesties Dominions, or in the parts
beyong the seas, any hereticall, seditious, schismatycall
or obesious booke, or pamphlet wherin any
doctrine or opinion shall bee asserted or maintained
which is contrary to the Christian faith, or the
doctrin or discipline of the Church of England, or
whiche shall by may teach, or bee to the scandall of
Religion or the Church or the government, or govern-
or the church, state, or commonweale, or of any corporation
or particular person or persons whatsoever, or shall
publish, sell, or distred any such booke or bookes or pamphlet
nor shall cause or procure any such to bee published or putt
to sale, or to bee bound, stiched or boord together, clerk bee
it further ordyned and enacted by the cluthorite aforesaid
that no person, or persons whatsoever shall at any time
hereafter print or cause to bee printed any booke, or
pamphlett whatsoever vnsesse the same booke and pamphlett
together with all and every the titles, epistles, placards,
proemys, preambles, interlineacions, tables, dedicacions and
other matter and things therunto annexed, but first entry
in the booke of the Register of the Company of Stationers
of London, and unless the same booke and pamphlett
and every the said titles, epistles, prefacioes, proemys, preambles
introducions, tables, dedicacions, and other matter and
things whatsoever therunto annexed, or therwith to bee
imprinted shall bee first lawfully lured or autorized
to bee printed by such person, and persones only as shall
be constituted and appointed to luren the same
according to the direction, and true meaning of this
present clerk hereon after expressed, and by no other, v-
hat is to say, that all booke concerning the common-
lawnes of this Realme shall bee printed by the
principal secretaries of state, or secretary of
the grete seal of England for the time being, the
Lordis chyfste Justicer, and chyfste Chanceler for the
time being, or one or more of them, or by thoir
or more of their appointments, clerk that all booke of

because a great parte of the secret printing in London hath
been caused for want of orderly iuxition for journeymen printers
The said several Master printer and Master founder of lettere for
printing see to bee altered as aforesaid are hereby required to take
special care that all journeymen printers and journeymen founders
of lettere for printing who are lawfully free of the said rote
Mistresse bee set to worke and employed in their respective trades
and if any such journeymen printer or journeymen founder of
lettere be of honest and good behaviour and able in his trade
decouant iuxition hee shall reparis to any of the said Master
printers or Master founders of lettere respettively for the tymbe
being who thereroun shall receave hym or them into worke

(8) If any master printer or master founder of lettere have not
a journeymen already although such Master printer or Master
founder of lettere respectively with his exxentente or exxentente
hee able without the noise of the said journeymen to fistinge his
owne workes upon paine that every Master printer and Master founder
of lettere respectively refusing to settynge such journeymen repairing
to him as aforesaid shall forfeite five poundes to bee recovered by

without iurys Bee it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid

to search all houses and shoppes whiche they shall come vpon
vpon some probable reason suspeyning booke or paper to

with the severall Wardens and to bring them before one or
more Justices of the peace who are hereby imcommande and
required to comit hym offendre to prison there to remaine

Provided also That neither this Act nor anything therein contained
shall extend to restrain the keeping and using of a Printing-^{P. & S.}
in the City of York soe as all Books of Divinity, Moral & Pamber,
be first licens'd by the Arch Bishopp of Yorke for the time being
or such person or persons whom he shall account and all other
Books whatsoever shalbe printed be first licens'd by such person
respectively to whom the licensing thereof doth or shall appear
by the rules herein before mentioned and soe as noo Bibles be reuin
printed nor any other book wherof the original copye is, or shall be
belonging to the company of Stationers in London or any Member
thereof and soe as the Arch Bishopp or Mayor of Yorke for the
time being doth & coulde within the said City of Yorke and Liberty
impart to doth all the powers and rules in this Act entiteling
for unlycensed books and printing in the said City the said
person byt in the like cases Any thing in this Act to the contrary
notwithstanding.

Provided also, that neither this Act, nor any thing therein contained, shall extend to
privilegia any Bookseller, who hath served seven years, and is free of the Company of Stationers
London, from importing or bringing into this Realme, any other ^{not formerly prohibited} Books, which have been
printed ten years, before the said importation, any thing in this or any other Act to the
contrary notwithstanding. Provided also, and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,
that neither this Act, nor any thing therein contained, shall be construed to prohibit,
any person or persons, to sell Books or papers, within twenty yards of the Great
Hall, the Pallace of Westm^t, or in any shop or shoppes, within twenty yards of the Great
gate of Westm^t wall aforesaid, before the twentieth day of November, one
thousand six hundred sixty and one, but they and every of them may, sell Books and
papers, as they have or did, before the said twentieth day of November 1661: a
within the said Hall, Pallace, and twenty yards aforesaid, but not elsewhere, any
thing in this Act to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding. Provided also, that
neither this Act, nor any thing therein contained, shall extend to preclude, the
just rights or privileges granted by his Majestie, or any of his Regall predecessors
to any person or persons, under his Majesties Great Seal or otherwise, but that such
person or persons may exercise and use sume rights and privileges as aforesaid,
according to their respective grants, and thing in this Act to the contrary
notwithstanding. Provided also, that neither this Act, nor any thing therein contained
shall extend to preclude John Streater Stationer from printing Books and papers,
but that he may still follow this Act and mystery of printing, as if this Act had
never been made, any thing herein to the contrary notwithstanding.
