C A P. XXXVIII.

An A& for the Encouragement of the Arts of defigning and printing Linens, Cottons, Callicoes and Muslins, by vesting the Properties thereof in the Designers, Printers and Proprietors, for a limited time.

WHEREAS it may be expedient, for the Encouragement of the Arts of defigning original Patterns for printing Linens, Callicoes, Cottons and Muslims, to vest the Property thereof in the Designers, Printers or Proprietors, for a limited time; for which Purpose May it please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spinalesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spinalesty, by and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled,

affembled, and by the Authority of the same, That, from and atter the First Day of June One thousand seven hundred and eighty feven, every Person who shall invent, design and print, or cause to be invented, designed and printed, and become the Proprietor of any new and original Pattern or Patterns for printing Linens, Cottons, Callicoes, or Muslims shall have the sole Right and Liberty of printing and reprinting the same for the Term of Two Months (a), to commence from the Day of the first publithing thereof, which shall be truly printed with the Name of the Printer or Proprietors at each End of every fuch Piece of Linen, Cotton, Callicoe or Muslin; and that if any Callicoe Printer, Linen Draper or other Perfon whatfoever, from and after the First Day of June One thousand seven hundred and eighty seven, within the time limited by this Act, shall print, work or copy, such original Pattern or Patterns, or cause to be printed, worked or copied, fuch original Pattern or Patterns, or shall print or reprint, or cause to be printed or reprinted, any such Pattern or Patterns, and shall publish, sell or expose to Sale, or in any other manner dispose of, or cause to be published, sold or exposed to Sale, or in any other manner disposed of, any Linen, Cotton, Callicoe or Muslin, so printed without the Consent of the Proprietor or Proprietors thereof, first had and obtained in Writing, figned by him or them respectively, in the Presence of Two or more credible Witnesses, knowing the same to be so printed or reprinted without the Consent of the Proprietor or Proprietors of such Pattern, then every such Proprietor or Proprietors shall and may, if the Offence be committed in England, by and in a special Action upon the Case, to be brought against the Person or Persons so offending, recover such Damages as a Jury on the Trial of fuch Action, or on the Execution of a Writ of Enquiry thereon, shall give or assess, together with Costs of Suit, in which no Wager of Law, Effoin, Privilege or Protection, or more than One Imparlance, shall be allowed; and if the Offence be committed in Scotland, every fuch Proprietor or Propries tors shall and may, by an Action to be brought before the Court of Session, or any Judge competent to try Civil Causes within his Bounds, recover fuch Damages as the faid Court of Seffion, or the faid Judge, shall give or assess, and for Payment whereof Decree shall be issued, with full Costs of Suit, on which all such Execution shall pass as is competent by the Laws and Practice of Scotland in the like cases: Provided nevertheless, that it shall and may be lawful for any Person or Persons who shall hereafter purchase any Plate or Plates. Block or Blocks, for printing, from the original Proprietors thereof, to print, reprint and expose for Sale, or cause to be printed, reprinted and exposed for Sale, from the faid Plates or Blocks, without being liable to any Action (a) [Three Months, 34 G. 3. c. 23.] on that Account.

II. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That if any Action or Suit shall be commenced or brought against any Person or Persons whatsoever, for any Offence committed against this Act, the same shall be brought within the Space of Six Months after so doing, and the Desendant and Desendants, in such Action or Suit, if brought in England, shall and may plead the General Issue, and give the special Matter in Evidence; and if, upon such Action or Suit, a Verdict shall be given

given for the Defendant or Defendants, or if the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs become nonfuited, or discontinue his, her or their Action or Actions, then the Defendant or Defendants shall have and receive full Costs; for the Recovery whereof he shall have the same Remedy as any other Defendant or Defendants in any other case hath or have by Law; and if such Action be brought in Scotland, and not insisted in, or if the Defender be associated, then the Defender shall be entitled to full Costs, for the Recovery whereof he shall have the same Remedy as hereinbefore is given to the Pursuer.

That this Act shall continue in force for One Year, and from thence to the End of the then next Soffion of Parliament; and shall be deemed, adjudged and taken to be a Publick Act; and be judicially taken Notice of as such, by all Judges, Justices and other

Persons whatsoever without specially pleading the same.

CAP. XXXIX.

An Act for appointing Commissioners further to enquire EXP. into the Losses and Services of all such Persons who have suffered in their Rights, Properties and Professions, during the late unhappy Dissensions in America, in consequence of their Loyalty to His Majesty, and Attachment to the Brtiss Government.

#### CAP. XL.

An Act to indemnify fuch Persons as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments; and to indemnify Justices of the Peace, or others, who have omitted to register or deliver in their Qualifications within the time limited by Law, and for giving further time for those Purposes; and to indemnify Members and Officers, in Cities, Corporations and Borough Towns, whose Admissions have been omitted to be stamped according to Law, or, having been stamped, have been lost or missaid; and for allowing them time to provide Admissions duly stamped; and to give further time to such Persons as have omitted to make and sile Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors.
